The first service project our club did was to prepare lunches for workers who live at the SERVE shelter. We created

an assembly line and created a lunch that consisted of a ham and cheese sandwich, an apple, chips, and a desert. With added a note of encouragement from the group in each bag.

On February 9th the group went to Park Place, the Senior Living Center that is adjacent to our school. We took some board games and dominoes and played with some seniors. They really seemed to enjoy our company.
